Brain Aneurysms

Know the treatment options!

Brain aneurysms can be treated in several ways, depending on the aneurysm size, shape and location, risk of rupture and your age. Treatments include surgical clipping, coiling or careful monitoring.

- Clipping is a type of surgery that requires an incision in your skull. The surgeon gently places a tiny titanium clip around the stem of the aneurysm, cutting off the blood flow to the aneurysm.
- Coiling is when fine platinum coils are inserted through a catheter. The coils are threaded through an artery in the groin, to the brain and into the aneurysm. This blocks the blood supply and seals it off.

Your doctor will discuss the different treatment options with you.
